

## MATH 141 - RULES FOR THE TEST (QUIZ 1A)

§ Room MS-418 is on the fourth floor of the huge MS-100 building (near the Marlesta/Chasewood entrance to the campus). In MS-100:

- From the main elevators, make three rights (or a left to the back door).
- From the main stairs, make two rights (to the back or front doors).
- You may enter using either door.

§ For the test, bring:

- Mask
- HW
- Scientific calculator
- Pencil / pen / eraser
- Photo ID
- Water bottle + snacks (suggested)

§ If you take a bathroom break (try to avoid):

- Give me your cell phone.
- I expect to photograph your test.

§ I'll hand out scratch paper.

- The back of a test may be used as scratch; it depends on the # of pages.
- Turn in **all** scratch paper with your test.
- Staple what you want graded.
- Only neat work will be graded.
- On the main test, write "SEE SCRATCH" (or the like) on a problem you are continuing on scratch paper.

§ When you're done, give the test to me.

- I may have solutions available for you to check after the test.
- Return to your desk or exit quietly. You may work on your HW.
- Do not discuss the test. People may come in late.

§ Quiz 1A on Chapter 0 will be 1 hour and 15 minutes.

- There will be a 10-minute break for everyone after the test.
- Come back to class for Section 1.3 ... and maybe some HW questions.

§ Turn in the HW.

- You may turn in the HW a bit after class, but don't forget!
- I will collect the HW at the beginning,  
    though you may be able to fix some of it after class.
- Staple your HW.
- Make sure name is on each stapled packet.
- No thick binders! It may take a while for you to get the HW back.
